

COLLECTING IMPRESSIONS



HOW DO YOU KEEP YOUR MEMORIES?

Do you take photos of places you visit? Or write about people you meet? Do you ever draw pictures of events that you want to always remember? Many artists do! But how do you remember everyday things, like what your neighborhood looks like, or how you wear your favorite outfit?

Artists have always recorded their lives. In the new exhibition *Collecting Impressionism at LACMA*, you will get a look at what life was like in France over 100 years ago. A group of artists called Impressionists wanted to show modern life in Paris. That meant they painted what was happening in parks, cafés, and on the streets.

Jean Béraud painted *A Parisian Street Scene: Boulevard des Capucines* in 1897. When you look at this painting, you can see what this busy street was like. People walked or took rides in horse-drawn carriages, sat at outdoor cafés, and went shopping. You can see the fashion of the day, how advertisements were displayed, and what the architecture looked like, as well as the fanciful metal grates around the base of trees. Looking at this painting, you can probably guess the time of day and what the weather was like when it was made.


